Yellow Ribbon Program Participation Supports Substantial Veteran Presence at MIIS

Monterey, CA—For the third year in a row, the [Monterey Institute of International Studies](#) has been named a “Military Friendly School” by [G.I. Jobs](#), signifying that it ranks in the top 15 percent of colleges, universities and trade schools that are doing the most to embrace America’s military service members, veterans, and spouses as students and ensure their success on campus.

“The Monterey Institute welcomes veterans of our armed forces and their families and is an enthusiastic participant in the Yellow Ribbon program,” commented Institute President Sunder Ramaswamy. The federally-funded [Yellow Ribbon program](#) provides scholarship support up to half the cost of education at participating schools to qualifying veterans and their spouses. The Institute supplies the remaining funding for most qualifying veterans, providing a fully-funded bachelor’s and/or master’s degree. The Institute currently has 51 veterans of the U.S. military enrolled, or 6.5 percent of the total student body of 790.
